

TOURS REPORT

As previously advised, at its meeting in December the Committee considered a previously circulated summary of members' thoughts about future tours for their consideration. I had a very poor and disappointing response from members only seven members out of a membership in excess of ninety bothered to supply their views but those received made for an interesting collection of suggestions. The Committee decided not to basically change anything and asked that I organise a trip to the Mudgee region using the 21-seat executive coach used for the previous Parkes/Dubbo Trip in the second part of 2026 year. More on this in future as arrangements are put together.

You may recall that the Committee also decided that I should not further advertise the five-day Murray Region Explorer trip starting on 2nd March 2026. We will stick with keeping the starters to members of our club plus the few from Albion Park Probus who have already paid their deposits. At that time we still had more than the minimum number of potential starters to cover the pricing options open to us. The full number of members who have indicated that they were interested has fluctuated a bit and as of last week there are 32 starters including the six from the Albion Park Probus Club. Now the numbers seem to have settled I can confirm that after taking the deposits paid the balance payable is \$1139 per person for a double or twin share room and \$1379 per person for those who want a single room. Some have paid their final payments already, for which I thank them, and the balance from all other starters is due by the end of January 2026. I will be contacting all starters individually within the next week or so.

I have arranged a Corrimal pickup and drop off and a second Illawarra based pickup and drop off point. I have been advised by the majority of starters from Albion Park of their preferred pickup and drop off point. I will be notifying the coach company of this within the next few days and get confirmation of the pickup times for each location.



Our guest speaker for 29 January 2026 will be Stuart Traynor. Stuart will give a presentation about his Christmas in Darwin 1974 when Cyclone Tracy hit the city. It is just over 50 years since the catastrophic event that devastated the city of Darwin. Cyclone Tracy was one of the most intense and destructive tropical cyclones in Australia's history. The wind gusts reached up to 240 km/h causing widespread destruction and claimed 71 lives. Almost 70% of the homes in Darwin were destroyed.

I am sure Stuart will have a very interesting presentation with lots of illustrations to show us.
